


Here are some tips on how to keep your office and home electronics clean.



PRINTERS & MULITFUNCTION DEVICES

- 1. Slightly moisten a clean, soft, lint free, cotton cloth with a mixture of 70% isopropyl alcohol and 30% water (rubbing alcohol).
- 2. Gently wipe moistened cloth on surfaces to be cleaned. Never spray liquids directly onto a device.
- 3. Ensure surfaces have air-dried before using the device again.

SCREENS

- 1.Slightly moisten a microfiber cloth with distilled water or a mixture of distilled water and rubbing alcohol (1:1). Eyeglass cleaner also works. If the screen has an anti-reflective coating, use distilled water only.
- 2.Gently wipe moistened cloth on surfaces to be cleaned. Never spray liquids directly onto a





KEYBOARDS


- 1. Tip over to gently shake crumbs from keyboard.
- 2.Blow out any remaining debris with canned air.

 Cleaning gels and USB mini vacuums can also be helpful.
- 3. Finish up by wiping over keys with a distilled water and rubbing alcohol solution. Cotton swabs can be used to clean the small areas. Never spray liquids directly onto a device.

MOUSE, REMOTES, & CONTROLLERS

- 1. Unplug or remove batteries before cleaning.
- 2.Brush on and between buttons with a small brush or toothbrush used for cleaning.
- 3.Lightly spray electronics cleaner or rubbing alcohol/distilled water mixture on a cloth and gently wipe the item from top to bottom.
- 4.Use a slightly damp cotton swab between the buttons or hard to reach small areas.





- 1. Wipe the device with a dry cloth to remove dust.
- 2. Never spray speakers with liquids.
- 3.If buildup or fingerprints won't easily come off, use a lightly dampened cloth.
- 4.If dust remains in speaker or device mesh, blow with canned air or a blowdryer on the cool setting.
